KHAPRA BEETLE*



Names/Aliases: Khapra beetle (*Trogoderma granarium*)

Last Known Address: Originated in India. Currently established in several countries in Europe, Africa, and Asia.

Field ID: Adults (about 1.6-3.4 mm long) have hairy, oval, brown to black bodies. Forewings with indistinct reddish-brown markings. Females are noticeably larger than males. Mature larva can reach a length of about 4.0-6.0 mm and has yellowish-brown body covered with relatively long reddish-brown hairs.

CAUTION

One of the world's most destructive pests of stored products. It was recorded feeding on barley, beans, cereal products, corn, dried milk, dried fruits, fishmeal, nuts, oats, peas, rice, wheat, and others.
